Pipeline project reaches trail site

Minor detours expected along Iron Horse Trail as construction continues between Dublin, Danville.

Construction of a 75-mile pipeline that will carry recycled water from Dublin to Danville has reached the Iron Horse Trail.

The trail will remain open during the construction, although there may be some minor detours, according to the Dublin San Ramon Services District and East Bay Municipal Utilities District Recycled Water Authority.

The pipeline's construction is part of the San Ramon Valley Recycled Water Program. The pipeline will carry non-potable water that will help irrigate parks, golf courses, business parks and grassy areas at schools and along roadways.

Construction of treatment facilities, two storage tanks and the pipeline began in June and will continue for a year. Recycled water should begin flowing through the pipeline by spring.

The recycled water program is funded by DSRSD, EBMUD and state and federal agencies.
